They attended sessions on dance, art, weaving and language, where they learned to write and pronounce their name, and a variety of common phrases, in the Wiradjuri language. Tyler and Piquet also took part in Sport and Rec activities including archery tag and a variety of team games.

Both boys, and their accompanying teacher, had a wonderful time, returning from the camp inspired and exhausted!
